IMPORTANT NOTICE! - General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)

Changes are coming in this month relating to how organisations gather, store and process personal data. This legislation also gives individuals increased rights in relation to their personal information. HPP is committed to processing your personal data fairly and lawfully and to ensuring that your rights are respected in line with these requirements.

We will only hold personal data about you that we need in order to run our activities and keep you informed of what HPP is doing. We will never pass on any of your information to a third party.

"Members" (*i.e cast & crew from the 2017 production*) personal information is securely stored electronically and in paper form and is only accessible to the Directors & Committee. We review what we hold yearly and delete/shred information of anyone who has ceased to be a member.

"Friends" of HPP (*those people who have shown an interest in what we are doing*) currently receive our Newsletter by email. In order for us to continue to send you this information **your consent is needed**. Please complete and return the attached form by the end of May 2018, or you will no longer get our newsletters electronically.

We will continue to work through the new guidance and will update you on any further changes to the way we process your personal data.

Any HPP member who is holding data about other HPP members must, to comply with the act, erase all information held on computers or hard copy, unless the member is considered to be a personal friend.

A WAY OF THE CROSS WITH CHILDREN!

As reported in April's newsletter some of our company were delighted to go into St James School, Emsworth to share a Way of the Cross with the 120 junior children during Lent.

Introducing the Way of the Cross to the children.



Two Roman soldiers stand guard, while the children are invited to take part in this very special journey. Other actor followers stand by ready to accompany the cross.

Prior to the Collective Worship the children had all prepared a cut out footprint on which they had written a prayer. They were invited to place their footprint on the hall floor, to show that they were treading in the footsteps of Jesus on his Way of the Cross.

Many children took part in this very moving journey as, with the help of props, they took on the roles of the various people Jesus encountered on his way to Calvary. Two children wore cloaks and took up spears of the Roman soldiers. One pupil shouldered the cross. Others lay down their footprints at the start of the journey.

We sang, prayed and reflected on Scripture, as the journey unfolded. Every child in the hall was beautifully behaved, they were a credit to the school and to their families.

The HPP actors were very impressed and we can't wait to share another Collective Worship with you all in the future.
